Dear Friends

Music can touch parts of us in ways that nothing else can. Music can stir us up or open us to quiet reflection, it can awaken old memories or touch our spirits in new ways. We can sing words that we could never say, because music enables us to express all sorts of secret feelings, from love and devotion to grief and pain, physical, emotional or spiritual. As a young man I was a fan of the singer Barbra Streisand whose voice I found irresistibly expressive. More recently I acquired (at one of our village fetes, for 50p,) a CD of her songs called "Higher Ground". It isn't the sort of music I listen to or actually like very much now, but I mention it because it includes a song called "Everything must change" which ends with the statement, "... and music makes me cry", which, in Streisand's beguiling vocalisation, is an affirmation of this thing about the power of music.

In this age of constant and remorseless change, we might hear, in the song's opening verse, simply, a depressing if sentimental restatement of the Laws of Thermodynamics as applied to human life:

Everything must change, nothing stays the same;

Everyone must change, no one stays the same.

The young become the old, and mysteries do unfold

'Cos that's the way of time.

But the song goes on to contrast such laws of natural decay with the constantly varying yet dependably continuing Creation (and, I infer, its Creator) and the renewing and healing qualities of time.

Although not a religious song, it's theology seems to me pretty sound in suggesting that although everything and everyone changes, God, and his grace towards us, does not. Change is not something we find easy. The extent of change in the things we take for granted can unsettle us. Public life in this country, people's every day vocabulary, technology, relationships, the services we use and need, our ethical parameters, even the church; and this much change can disorient us and make us feel uncomfortable.

But God wants us to change, wants us to respond to him, wants us to grow in love and understanding towards each other, wants us to be transformed by our experience of the life that is his gift to us, because our transformation transforms the world, and helps to bring in his kingdom.

The challenge for us is to identify and welcome, amongst the many things that confront us each day, those changes which are life enhancing, which will deepen our sense of community and increase our respect for each other and our sense of God's unseen presence among us.

It's only February; this year may bring all sorts of surprisingly welcome change. I hope so!

St Elizabeth Hospice's high-profile ladies-only fundraising Midnight Walk is to break new ground by allowing men to take part. The Midnight Walk 2013 will welcome men and also offer a night-time run through Ipswich town centre.

The new-style event – which is the charity's biggest fundraiser of the year - will be held on **Saturday 18th May 2013** and starts from Ipswich Town Football Club. More than 220 men and women have already signed up but there is still time to register.

Patient Satisfaction

Many thanks to all of you who took the time to complete our *'Patient Satisfaction Survey'* before the Christmas break. Look out for the results of the survey on our Website. Any recommendations of the report will be considered by our Patient Participation Group – please let me know if you are interested in joining the group.

Blood Pressure Monitoring

We have a machine to measure your Blood Pressure in our waiting room. This can be used at any time that the surgery is open and you do not need to make an appointment. Please do feel free to check your blood pressure and hand the result to our receptionists. The result will be added to your medical record and then seen by your GP. Please note that the machine is not suitable for patients who have Atrial Fibrillation (AF).

Making appointments

Our phones can be busy first thing in the morning but we do have a number of other ways to make an appointment with a doctor. Have you registered for our on-line service? *Systmonline* allows you to book and cancel appointments on-line as well as order your repeat prescriptions. Ask our receptionists for your log in and password. Patients can also book an appointment over the phone using our Automated Service – press Option One when you telephone the surgery.

Dispensary

Just a reminder that our dispensers are happy to deal with any telephone queries that you may have from 11am onwards.

Childhood immunisations

Are your children's vaccinations up to date? Please check with your Health Visitor or ask our Practice Nurse to telephone you if you are not sure. There was a significant rise in the number of cases of Whooping Cough in 2012 (including an outbreak in Framlingham) and there were also reported cases of Measles in Suffolk. Please ensure that your child is protected.

Pregnant?

Women who are pregnant do not need to see a GP to confirm their pregnancy. Please make an appointment to see our Midwife. Appointments can be made at our reception. Due to the recent outbreaks of Whooping Cough, the Department of Health has recommended that all pregnant women are vaccinated to protect their baby. Please make an appointment with our Practice Nurse after the 28th week of your pregnancy.

Lighter Life Programme

A number of our patients are signing up for the Lighter Life Programme. As this programme is not provided by the NHS, there will be a £15 charge for patients who need a consultation with a doctor.
