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#### **Help is at hand to switch to digital TV**

TV is changing. In 2011 the traditional TV signal will be switched off in the Anglia region and replaced with a digital TV signal. This is not a concern for most people but some may find it harder to make the switch than others.

The Switchover Help Scheme has been set up by the Government and is run by the BBC. Its purpose is to make digital TV easy for older and disabled people by converting one of their televisions to digital in the run-up to digital TV switchover in their region.

People living in the Suffolk area served by the Ipswich Stoke transmitter will begin to switch on 06 July 2011.

#### **What does the Help Scheme do?**

The Switchover Help Scheme aims to reach out to all eligible people, and ensure that those who need our help get it, so that no-one eligible need be left behind without access to television after switchover.

People are eligible for help if they are:

- aged 75 or over,
- have lived in a care home for six months or more,
- get or could get, disability living allowance,
- attendance or constant attendance allowance, or mobility supplement,
- Or if they are registered blind or partially sighted.

**What's next?**

Most people will be asked to contribute £40 towards the help. The service is free for people who are eligible and also get pension credit, income support, income-based jobseekers allowance or employment and support allowance.

In the run-up to switchover, every eligible person receives a Switchover Help Scheme information pack explaining the options for switching to digital.

**Where can I get face-to-face advice on switchover?**

Digital UK has been working closely with charities to organise local advice points during switchover. These will be staffed by trained volunteers and are open to everyone. **Anglia Switchover date 2011**

**Switchover starts in the Anglia TV region in March 2011 and ends in November 2011.**

There are 3 transmitter groups in the Anglia TV region that will switch from analogue to digital TV at different times. The time at which you switch depends on which transmitter group you receive your signal from.

## TIMES PAST

Perhaps it is not widely known but Brandeston has connections with leprosy. In a charter dated during the reign of King John (1199-1216) Walter de Ribof gave 40 acres, a house and 13 other small pieces of land in Brandeston to the church of St James and the House of Lepers or Hospital in Dunwich.

This was for prayers to be made for the soul of Hugh de Cressie (1150-1205), husband of Margery de Cressie who was Lady of the Manor of Blyburgh and Walberswick. It was also given for the salvation of Walter's friends, successors and heirs. Walter also provided one comb of wheat each year at Michalemas together with two loaves 'from each baking at my house' and from each brewing one sester (2 gallons) of ale, along with an annual pension of 5 shillings to the 'Leporus Brethren'.

This was all done so that the Chaplain, Hubert of Dunwich and his successors should minister to one leper chosen by Walter and another leprous monk who was already at Dunwich. It is not known how many leprous monks were in residence, maybe twelve, nor how many lepers could be accommodated. The annual value of the gift would be about £3.00 or £700 in 1978, when a book was written on the subject entitled 'Men of Dunwich' by Rowland Parker.

At All Saints, Brandeston the font is considered the oldest part of the building, dating from the 13<sup>th</sup> century. This charter was made about the same time. It was witnessed by fourteen named witnesses including a prior, an archdeacon and two priests.

There are details included about where 'the workers' should worship on feast days and where they should be buried but it is not clear if this is to be at Brandeston or Dunwich. From a practical point of view it was probably at Dunwich because a journey at that time from Dunwich to Brandeston would be a very long, difficult and arduous experience.
