

Dear Friends,

Like many others I am not long back from holiday, from a trip to Africa where I spent two weeks in Zambia 'glamping' in the bush. But while I may have been under canvas, the tents had thatched roofs, wooden decks on the river bank, en suite bathrooms – one even had a roll top bath and a rain shower.

But one never visits Africa without being made aware of the almost indecent divide between rich and poor, and actually how much **we** have, that we don't need, and how little the local people can actually live on in a. country where a generous \$25 tip to one's ranger, was more than a month's wages.

Zambia is a peaceful, mainly agricultural country, it's a place where the women have tiny plots, smaller than our average allotment, which they call 'gardens' and from which they feed their families. Sometimes even having enough surplus to sell on grass matting at the side of the road, produce which may only be three or four tomato's and one aubergine, but it's all fresh and local, and seeing it made me think of the produce we bring to church when we celebrate our Harvest Festivals.

And it's during this month of September that we begin to think about our own village Harvest Festivals. So, do watch this magazine for the dates and times of yours, and maybe come to give thanks for the comfortable way of living we experience in rural Suffolk, and for the abundance, and richness of a life, which for us, is all too easy to take for granted.

NEWS FROM FRAMLINGHAM SURGERY

New Doctor!

I am very pleased to be able to tell you that we have a new GP who is joining the surgery from October 2013. Dr Charlotte Ridout is originally from Suffolk, and trained to be a General Practitioner at Kings College London, Guy's and St Thomas. Dr Ridout has been working in Surrey but she is moving back to Suffolk with her young family – I am sure that she will be made to feel very welcome at the surgery.

'Flu

We will have supplies of this year's 'flu vaccinations from early September. The Department of Health recommends a 'flu jab for everyone aged 65 and over as well as:

People with a serious medical condition:

- long term chest conditions such as asthma, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), bronchitis or emphysema;
- heart conditions such as heart failure, angina or atrial fibrillation
- kidney disease;
- liver disease such as cirrhosis or hepatitis;
- chronic neurological disease, such as Parkinson's disease or motor neurone disease;
- diabetes;
- a weakened immune system due to: a disease such as HIV; or treatment for some conditions such as cancer; or people taking special medicines for diseases such as rheumatoid arthritis or psoriasis.

All pregnant women

People who are in receipt of a carer's allowance, or those who are the main carer Additionally this year, the Department of Health recommends that all children who are two or three years old on 1 September 2013 (born between 2/9/2009 and 1/9/2011) receive a vaccination. Please speak to our Practice Nurses with any queries.

Please look out for the date of our October flu clinics.

Appointments

Our appointment slots with a GP are 10 minutes long. Some surgeries enforce the rule of 'one appointment, one problem' – meaning that patients can only bring up one issue in each 10 minute appointment. Whilst we have never enforced this rule, we do ask that if you have a number of things that you need to discuss with the doctor you ask for a double appointment. Please don't bring up issues relating to family members – they will need to make their own appointment!

Registering for electronic access

We are really pleased to tell you that 20% of our patients are now making use of our electronic ordering system - **SystmOnline.** This means that one in five of you are able to make an appointment, cancel an appointment or order your repeat prescription online. If you would like to sign up for this service, which is available 24 hours a day, please ask at our reception for your password and logon details.

Nurse Practitioner

Just a reminder that Janet Walne our Nurse Practitioner is available to deal with a range of minor illnesses and injuries like sore throats, earache, conjunctivitis, cuts and sprains, emergency contraception and urinary tract infections. Janet is a fully qualified, experienced Nurse Practitioner who is able to prescribe medication and has access to our GPs if required. Ask to see Janet when you phone up for an appointment!
